BEFORE YOU SIGN UP FOR AN INTERVIEW with Father Manship, youth and parents are asked **to review** the **“Signs for Readiness for the Celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation.”**

Youth: ARE YOU READY?

Parents, Do you believe that your child is ready to request the Sacrament of Confirmation?

Signs of Readiness for the Celebration of Confirmation

- 1) The candidate for Confirmation is comfortable in church, has a sense of belonging to our parish, regularly participated / participates in Sunday Masses (before and after restrictions).
- 2) Asks questions about God, Jesus, the Mass, the Church, and about how it relates to their lives.
- 3) The candidate for Confirmation prays and knows: the Sign of the Cross, Hail Mary, Our Father, Gloria Be, Act of Contrition, 10 Commandments, Apostles’ Creed.
- 4) Completed the assignments and assessments for each and all 8 lessons.
- 5) Interested in stories from the Bible, can look up passages, and wants to know more about Jesus.
- 6) Demonstrates knowledge of Christ and of the Paschal Mystery.
- 7) Recognizes and believes that the Eucharist is truly the Body and Blood of Christ.
- 8) Goes to Confession with some frequency.
- 9) Knows how to receive Holy Communion with reverence.
- 10) Understands the Sacrament of Confirmation.
